***Operation Christmas Child:** Samaritan's Purse works with local churches to deliver shoeboxes filled with gifts to children around the world. We are collecting hair brushes this week. Beginning next Sunday, we will be collecting stuffed animals for the next two weeks.

The congregation has been challenged to pray about the number of the boxes to be sent from the church for 2017. For the past two years, 1,500 shoeboxes were sent each year. Minimally, \$13,500 will be needed for postage (\$9 per box), and this goal has been reached. This past week, \$557 was given for a total of \$14,369. If more boxes are prepared, additional postage will be needed, and there may be a need to purchase items for the boxes.

Currently, we have 700 shoeboxes so we are in great need of shoeboxes, whether you purchase shoes and bring in the box or go to a store to see if they have any boxes they can donate. Samaritan's Purse has a new preprinted plastic shoebox this year. A limited supply of the new plastic shoeboxes are still available online at hobbylobby.com or at local Hobby Lobby stores. Standard shoeboxes can also be purchased online.

If you would like to wrap boxes, see Kelly Garner, and she will provide boxes along with wrapping paper and tape. There are opportunities to help sort and count items. See Kelly for this also. And, most of all, prayer is needed for this ministry and the children that will be reached. The shoeboxes will be assembled on Saturday, November 11th.

If you would like to give to this ministry, please take an offering envelope, mark "Shoe Box," enclose your gift, and place it in the collection plate. Any items being donated can be left in the red tubs in the lobby.
