Operation Christmas Child: Samaritan's Purse works with local churches to deliver shoe boxes filled with gifts to children around the world. Beginning today, we will be collecting pens, pencils, and sharpeners for the next two weeks. A list of the items to be collected is available at the Welcome Desk. Any items being donated can be left in the red tubs in the lobby.

We are also in need of 1,200 shoeboxes, whether you purchase shoes and bring in the box or go to a store to see if they have any boxes they can donate. Samaritan's Purse also has preprinted plastic shoeboxes that can be purchased at www.samaritanspurse.org or you can designate funds in the offering to purchase the shoeboxes (\$18 for a pack of 12).

We plan to pack 1,600 shoeboxes this year and have the monies for postage (\$9 per box for a total of \$14,400). This past week, \$358 was given for a total of \$16,569 in the Shoebox Fund. Additional items that are needed will be purchased in the few weeks just prior to the shoeboxes being packed, and there may be a need to purchase shoeboxes. If you can help, please take an offering envelope, mark "Shoe Box," enclose your gift, and place it in the collection plate.
