**Operation Christmas Child:** Samaritan's Purse works with local churches to deliver shoeboxes filled with gifts to children around the world. We are collecting crayons and markers this week. Beginning next week, we will be collecting erasers and pencil pouches for the next two weeks. A list of the items to be collected is available at the Welcome Desk. Any items being donated can be left in the red tubs in the lobby.

We are also in need of shoeboxes, whether you purchase shoes and bring in the box or go to a store to see if they have any boxes they can donate. Good news – 796 shoeboxes have been received bringing the number still needed to 804 (for a total of 1,600). Samaritan's Purse also has preprinted plastic shoeboxes that can be purchased at [www.samaritanspurse.org](http://www.samaritanspurse.org) or you can designate funds in the offering to purchase the shoeboxes (\$18 for a pack of 12).

We plan to pack 1,600 shoeboxes this year and have the monies for postage (\$9 per box for a total of \$14,400). This past week, \$482 was given for a total of \$18,801 in the Shoebox Fund. Additional items that are needed will be purchased in the few weeks just prior to the shoeboxes being packed, and there may be a need to purchase shoeboxes. If you can help, please take an offering envelope, mark "Shoe Box," enclose your gift, and place it in the collection plate.
