Giving Tree: Each year our church has a decorated tree in the vestibule called the "Giving Tree." The money collected this year through the "Giving Tree" will be designated for Pastor Brian and Naomi Mason of the Ontonagon Baptist Church in Ontonagon and the North Star Baptist Church in South Range. The water coming to the Mason's home has excessive levels of iron and manganese, and this is a very common water problem in many U.S. homes. This causes discoloration, odor, and taste issues. The family has purchased a water treatment & purification system, and they are currently making payments on the system. We want to share a praise that the funds that have already been donated to the Giving Tree will cover the remaining balance that the Mason's owe on the water treatment system for their home. Any additional funds that are received for the Giving Tree will be a love offering for the Mason family. If you wish to contribute, you can take an envelope from the Giving Tree or take an envelope and mark "Giving Tree" then enclose your gift and place it in the collection plate.

Operation Christmas Child: Keep praying for the kids that the shoeboxes will reach. Along with their shoebox gift, children also receive "The Greatest Gift," a colorful presentation of the Gospel in their own language. After receiving shoebox gifts, boys and girls are invited to enroll in "The Greatest Journey," a 12-lesson discipleship program. They learn from trained local volunteers what it means to faithfully follow Christ and share their faith with others.

Although we won't officially start collecting items until the middle of January, you can still bring in shoe boxes. The recommended size for the shoe boxes is: Length – 12" to 14"; Width – 7" to 9"; and Height: 4" to 5".
